Children's museums believe....

- Children are valued citizens with the right to access resources promoting development and well-being.
- Play is learning and it is critical to a heathy social, emotional, and cognitive development of children.
- Children are shaped by family, culture, and environment and the institution should reflect these in the museum experience.



WHY PLAY?

Play is our brain's favorite way to learn. Deep learning takes place when learning is joyful, meaningful, actively engaged, iterative, and social. These are the very characteristics of play, and it shapes how a child develops. Play is also a way for kids to experience less stress, especially stressors caused by poverty. But play is not only beneficial to children, but it also influences family relationships. Playful experience between adult and child supports family bonding and well-being.
